Keynote Speakers

Kevin Gilmartin Post 16 Specialist, Association of School and College Leaders. In this role, he provides the latest support and advice to heads of sixth form in schools and colleges and to other members wanting clarification over the latest government policies and plans for the post-16 sector. Kevin's work with the DfE in this area has made him a national figure in the debate over the future shape of the 16-19 landscape. Kevin also represents members in talks with the DfE over 16-19 performance measures, with UCAS over developments in university admissions, and with the Careers and Enterprise company over CEIAG and student destinations. Prior to joining ASCL, Kevin spent 30 years working in post-16 education, including secondary schools and FE colleges, before finishing his teaching career as a sixth form principal.

Katharine Radice is an education consultant specialising in dispositions which facilitate academic progress and personal growth. Katharine has a broad range of experience: she has taught in independent and maintained sector schools and at undergraduate university level. She has worked in mixed, single-sex, boarding and day schools and studied adolescent development at the Tavistock and Portman NHS Trust. She brings to the sessions her practical perspective on classroom teaching, middle and senior management roles. Previous attendees have described her training sessions as inspiring, thought-provoking, full of practical advice and engaging.

Martin Griffin has 20 years' experience teaching GCSE and post-16 students in colleges as a sixth-form teacher, head of faculty, assistant head teacher and deputy head teacher. He was the director of sixth form at a twice Ofsted-outstanding comprehensive sixth form where student progress was among the top 10 per cent in the country. He spent much of his time teaching A-Levels and GCSEs and testing tools for study skill development. Over the last five years has worked with more than a hundred colleges and schools to develop effective non-cognitive skill development systems. He is the co-author of the A-Level Mindset (Crown House, 2016) The GCSE Mindset (Crown House, 2017) and The Student Mindset (Crown House, 2018).

Since leaving full-time employment with Ofsted in 2015 Marina Gaze has specialised in supporting education leaders to rapidly improve their provision. She has 25 years' inspection experience and is a current Ofsted inspector. As Ofsted's Deputy Director for Further Education and Skills, she was responsible for inspection policy and methodology. She developed and delivered Ofsted's Masters' Degrees in Inspection and Regulation with the University of Warwick and with the Institute of Education. She holds several board positions and helps boards learn how to support, challenge and work effectively. She is in strong demand as a speaker, trainer, and coach.

Matt Bromley is an education writer and advisor with over twenty years' experience in teaching and leadership including as a secondary school Headteacher and principal, FE College vice principal, and MAT director. He is a public speaker, trainer, and school improvement lead, and a primary school governor. He remains a practising teacher, currently working in secondary, FE and HE settings. Matt writes for various newspapers and magazines, is the author of numerous best-selling books on education, and regularly speaks at national and international conferences and events.

Marcus Sharrod is the Director of Coaching & Mentoring at Marlborough College, Wiltshire. In this colleague-facing and centred role, Marcus is responsible for teacher development. He leads on internal professional development, creating a bespoke programme of workshops, and leads on Early Career Teaching framework, trainee teachers, the induction of new staff. Marcus is also responsible for academic intervention, which he has designed with a coaching and mentoring lens.

Backed by a degree in management, **Tim Hudson** has spent much of his time working in the education sector. He has both worked internally and consulted externally for several schools, working with teachers and students alike. Some of these leadership programs have included ones for people who are new to middle management, those looking to step up to senior management, and those looking to bring in change. He has helped schools develop their strategies around gifted and talented / scholarship programmes and wider co-curricular offerings to ensure they quietly support the behavioural and developmental aims as students grow in a school.

Ben Stephenson is currently Director of Sixth Form at Queen Anne's School, Caversham which achieved their best A-level results in 2019 (excluding the CAGs in 2020). Previously Ben led a required improvement Sixth Form to an Ofsted Good where it was highlighted "The recently appointed, effective leader of the sixth form is improving provision and standards for all students". Ben is also a Trustee of an Academy with an Outstanding Sixth Form provision. He has previously presented at the Keynote Heads of Sixth Form Conference on how to effectively teach revision. He co-edited the Brain Can Do Revision Handbook and his team's research into the impact of audio feedback on Sixth Form students was published in The Chartered College of Teaching Impact Journal. Laura Chambers has worked at Hartpury College.

Alice Newton-Leeming has worked and studied within the field of suicide prevention for over 15 years. Completing her psychology degree in 2011, and volunteering as a Samaritans Listening Volunteer, Alice quickly moved into a role for a national Suicide Prevention Charity in the UK and progressed to managing a national helpline and training team around the country, delivering training relating to suicide prevention. Alice has worked for organisations such as Mind, Mental Health Learning, Listening Ear, Every Life Matters and YoungMinds providing emotional support, suicide bereavement support and training to equip individuals to support those around them. Alice also has a passion for supporting others to understand how to look after their own wellbeing. She is a strong advocate for self-care and implores anyone she meets to make time for themselves, because we all deserve it.
