Dame Alison Peacock

Dame Alison Peacock is Chief Executive of the Chartered College of Teaching, a charitable Professional Body that seeks to empower a knowledgeable and respected teaching profession through membership and accreditation. Prior to joining the Chartered College, she was Executive Headteacher of The Wroxham School in Hertfordshire.

Her career to date has spanned primary, secondary and advisory roles. She is an Honorary Fellow of Queens' College Cambridge, Hughes Hall Cambridge and UCL, a Visiting Professor of Glyndŵr University and a trustee for Big Change, the Helen Hamlyn Trust and an adviser to the Institute for Educational & Social Equity.

She is a Director of the Edge Foundation and has honorary degrees from the University of Brighton and University of Bath Spa. She is a Deputy Lieutenant for Hertfordshire. Her research is published in a series of books about Learning without Limits offering an alternative approach to inclusive school improvement.



Claire Mulhern

Claire Mulhern is School Improvement Advisor for Discovery Schools Academy Trust, a high-performing family of primary, secondary and special schools in the East Midlands. She is a former headteacher with a passion for providing a rich and balanced curriculum and levelling the playing field for disadvantaged children.

As Curriculum Leader for thirteen Microsoft Showcase primary schools, she specialises in innovative and inclusive curriculum design, enhancing learning through Pedtech and harnessing progression for mixed-age classes. She is a trustee for a schools' mental health charity, has seven years' experience writing and delivering course content for two outstanding School Centred Initial Teacher Training providers and facilitated NPQS for a number of years.



Dr. Kulvarn Atwal

Dr. Kulvarn Atwal has spent his entire career teaching and leading in East London schools, and is currently Principal Learning Leader of two large primary schools. He has been a Head Teacher of three different schools and his first action in each school he has led is to develop dialogic teaching and begin the journey to becoming a Rights Respecting School.

One of his schools, Highlands Primary, has been awarded the Mayor of London's Schools for Success Award for five consecutive years. This award was given to schools that made the greatest progress for its low prior attainers. His doctoral thesis investigated the factors that impact upon teacher engagement in professional learning in schools. His findings were published in 2019 in his first book, 'The Thinking School' and he has recently released his second book, 'The Thinking Teacher'. He is currently Vice Chair of the Head Teachers' Round Table.



Julie Carson

Julie Carson is Director of Education at Woodland Academy Trust, where she leads school improvement, curriculum development, and digital transformation across five primary schools in Bexley and Kent. With over 25 years in education, including 18 years in leadership as Headteacher, Executive Headteacher, and School Improvement Advisor, she is deeply committed to inclusion and innovation.

She specialises in AI and Universal Design for Learning (UDL), creating a Trust-wide pedagogical framework that helped secure Apple Distinguished School status for one school and recognition as an Apple Regional Training Centre for the Trust. She also contributes to national and international discussions on AI in education and digital equity.

She holds an MA (with distinction) in Educational Leadership and the NPQEL, and in 2025 received a Silver Award for Digital Innovation in the Pearson National Teaching Awards for her pioneering work.



Dawn Ferninand

Dawn Ferdinand is in her 25th year of headship and is Headteacher of the Year in a Primary School 2024-2025. She is currently the Co-Headteacher of The Willow Primary School and Broadwaters' Children's Centre. She took on leadership of The Willow in 2008 when it was rated 'Satisfactory' by Ofsted. Under her leadership, the school achieved 'Outstanding' in both 2017 and 2023, and the Children's Centre childcare received Ofsted Outstanding in 2016 and 2022.

She has also been an Executive Headteacher and a co-founding member of several organisations, including Nia, BEN (Black Educators' Network – both Islington and Haringey), and NYLA (Northside Young Leaders Academy). She is committed to school improvement, working as a consultant with Haringey Education Partnership, and runs her own company, Ferdinand Leadership Education Excellence (FLE-x). A strong advocate for inclusion, Dawn is passionate about improving outcomes for vulnerable children and works tirelessly to ensure that all children have opportunities to thrive.
